

## SCHEDULE OF CLASSES & GATHERINGS January – November 2015

**February** We will continue to work with Bjarni Haraldsson and others developing the budget, script and timeline for a new documentary movie on the work of The Tracking Project.

**March (dates to be determined) Nurturing the Roots (NTR) / Mentor Outreach, Polynesia.** We will travel to the Hawaiian Islands to continue our work with our mentor circle and with others in the community we have met in recent years.

**April 19 - 29 Nutrindo as Raízes / Mentor Outreach Brazil.** A team from The Tracking Project will travel to Florianopolis, Santa Catarina to take part in the second year of our new community mentor program for Brazilian educators. (This program is by invitation only.)

**April / May (Dates to be determined) Teacher training, Akwesasne Mohawk community, New York.** We are putting together a program with several groups in Akwesasne that work with youth, rites of passage and survival skills. A team from The Tracking Project will travel to the Mohawk Nation to offer teacher training and mentoring to the various groups.

**May 23 - 30 Nurturing the Roots: New Mexico (NTR/NM) , Cuba, New Mexico.** We will embark on the first year of a new three year mentor program with artists and educators from around the country at the Circle A Ranch. (This program is by invitation only.)

**June 23 - 28 Fresh Tracks (Novas Pegadas), Camp Davis, Rociada, New Mexico.** A team from The Tracking Project will meet with youth from around the United States and Brazil for the second year of this new national camp. This gathering is an outgrowth of our work with our Brazilian partners — **Projeto Pegadas Brasil**. Our students will study animal tracking, survival skills and the Arts of Life.

**\* July 11 - 18 Hawkeye Training, Cuba, New Mexico.** A week-long skills camp for boys ages 12–18, held near Cuba, New Mexico. Skills include tracking, survival,

Nature awareness, music, story, dance, comedy and the martial arts. Limited to 30 boys. This will be the twenty-ninth year of the Hawkeye camp! For information and registration, contact: The Tracking Project, (505) 898-6967. Cost: \$600.

\* **July 11 - 18 Hawkeye Scout, Cuba, New Mexico.** This will be the seventeenth year for this advanced training camp for young men. Skills include advanced tracking, stalking, movement and living on the land. Limited to 13 young men. For information and registration, contact: The Tracking Project, (505) 898-6967, Cost: \$600.

\* **July 25 - August 1 Dreamtracking, Cuba, New Mexico.** Our week-long skills camp for girls, ages 10–16, now in its twentieth year. Offering basic tracking and survival skills, music, story, dance and natural movement training, this camp is a counterpart to our Hawkeye Training camp for boys. Limited to 30 girls. \* **August 22 - 29 Tracking in the Southwest, Cuba, New Mexico.** Join us for this Southwestern tracking intensive — a hiking, camping and tracking journey to the heart and soul of northern New Mexico. A unique opportunity to learn about animal tracking, survival skills, Native cultures and the Arts of Life while camping out in the land of the Anasazi. Limited to 20 people.
