**January The Tracking Project Institute, Corrales.** Together with our staff and advisors, we are re-designing our website, archiving our past work and laying the groundwork for a renewal and expansion of our programs which will allow us to share more information, bring more people together and reach more people around the world.

**February 17 - 25 Haiku 'Aina Permaculture Institute (HAPI), Haiku, Maui.** We will travel to HAPI for a series of meetings regarding a new gathering — A Call to Conscience — which we are planning to bring our friends from French Polynesia to meet with members of the Hawaiian community at this permaculture / organic food project on Maui.

**March 5 Bosque School Winterim, Albuquerque, New Mexico.** John Stokes will join Bosque staff member / NTR mentor Sean Etigson for a day of tracking in the Bosque and arnis with a group of 6th graders.

**April 17 - 18 Mentoring, The Tracking Project, Corrales.** A long-time friend and educator from Germany will join us for a day of personal training in Corrales.

\* **April 26 - 28 The Tracking Project presents: Cultural Perspectives on Dreams and Dreaming Part 4 with John Stokes.** Through dream circles, storytelling, tracking exercises, journaling and discussions, John hopes to give participants new perspectives on how we can access our dreams — remembering dreams, recordings

dreams, sending and receiving dreams, incubating dreams... Using techniques of “dream tracking” we will look at dreaming through the eyes of many varied cultures and traditions. **June 15 - 22 Nurturing the Roots (NTR): Higher Teachings, Cuba, New Mexico.** Since 1996 The Tracking Project has conducted NTR mentor trainings for community artist/educators in the United States and other countries. We now invite graduates of our NTR programs to a series of higher teachings within **The Tracking Project’s** curriculum. This series will continue in June 2020.

\* **July 6 - 13 Hawkeye Training, Cuba, New Mexico.** ages 12–18, held near Cuba, New Mexico. Skills include tracking, survival, Nature awareness, music, story, dance, comedy and the martial arts. \* **July 20 - 27 Dreamtracking, Cuba, New Mexico.** Our week-long wilderness experience for young women, ages 12–18, now in its twenty fourth year.
