December 13 - 17, 2019 Haiku 'Aina Permaculture Institute (HAPI), Haiku, Maui. We will travel to HAPI for a series of meetings regarding food safety and a presentation for the staff and friends at this permaculture / organic food project on Maui.

* **April 24 - 26 Cultural Perspectives on Dreams and Dreaming with John Stokes, Arco Iris, Santa Fe.** Through dream circles, storytelling, tracking exercises, journaling and discussions, John will once again offer participants new perspectives on how we can access our dreams — remembering dreams, recordings dreams, sending and receiving dreams, incubating dreams... May (dates to be set) **Nurturing the Roots: Mentor Outreach**, Brasília, Brasil. John Stokes will join Duarte Guerra, Isabela Crema and other members of The Tracking Project's mentor circle to offer a new invitational training.

June 13 - 20 Nurturing the Roots (NTR): Higher Teachings, Cuba, New Mexico. Since 1996 The Tracking Project has conducted NTR mentor trainings for community artist/educators in the United States and other countries. Based on the success of the 2019 gathering, we now invite graduates of our NTR programs to the second in a series of higher teachings within **The Tracking Project's** curriculum.

* **July 11 - 18 Hawkeye Training, Cuba, New Mexico.** ages 12–18, held near Cuba, New Mexico. Skills include tracking, survival, Nature awareness, music, story, dance, comedy and the martial arts. Limited to 30 boys. **This will be the thirty fourth year of the Hawkeye camp.** For information and registration, contact: The Tracking Project, (505) 898-6967. Cost: \$650 + \$35 registration fee.

* **July 11 - 18 Hawkeye Scout, Cuba, New Mexico.** This will be the twenty first year for this advanced training camp for young men. Skills include advanced tracking, stalking, movement and living on the land. Limited to 13 young men. * **July 25 - August 1 Dreamtracking, Cuba, New Mexico.** Our week-long wilderness experience for young women, ages 16 - 30* , now in its twenty fifth year. Offering basic tracking and survival skills, music, story, dance and natural movement training, this camp is a counterpart to our Hawkeye Training camp for boys. Limited to 25 girls. In the past, **Dreamtracking** was an experience for younger women ages 12-18, but recently we have noticed that our teachings are particularly valuable to women ages 16-30, and so we are now offering higher levels of the teachings to this age group.)

September (dates to be determined) **Nutrindo as Raízes (Nurturing the Roots), Mentor Outreach / University of Peace (UNIPAZ), Brasil.** This visit will continue our work with our Brazilian mentor network and indigenous communities in the Xingu

Indigenous Preserve, as well as the *Formação do Jovens* program with the staff and youth of the UNIPAZ community.

October 9 - 11 Cultural Perspectives on Dreams and Dreaming with John Stokes, Arco Iris, Santa Fe.
